## **Study Updates**


- This summer we met our SIERA recruitment goal of enrolling 165 participants!
- What's next? We will be continuing data collection this Fall to complete follow-up videoconferences. These follow-ups are very important to help us understand your health over time.
- Additional opportunities: For those of you with upcoming follow-up video conferences, we will be contacting you soon to invite you into our lab for an optional in-person visit! You will be compensated extra for this visit, which would involve a blood draw and similar tests of language, learning, memory and physical function that we've done over video conference, but these would be in-person.
- Why the in-person visit? Your participation in this additional inperson visit will help us ensure our methods of remote data collection are just as valid as in-person data collection. We will also measure aspects of your health we can only assess inperson.
